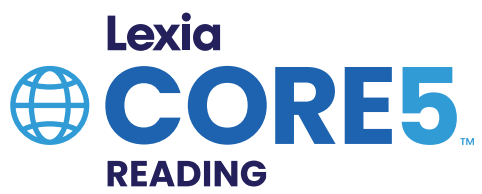

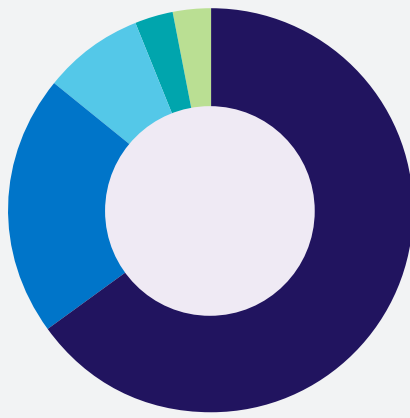

I saw him go from no English usage to being at or above grade level. In his third year, he’s on grade level. From zero to grade level is HUGE.”

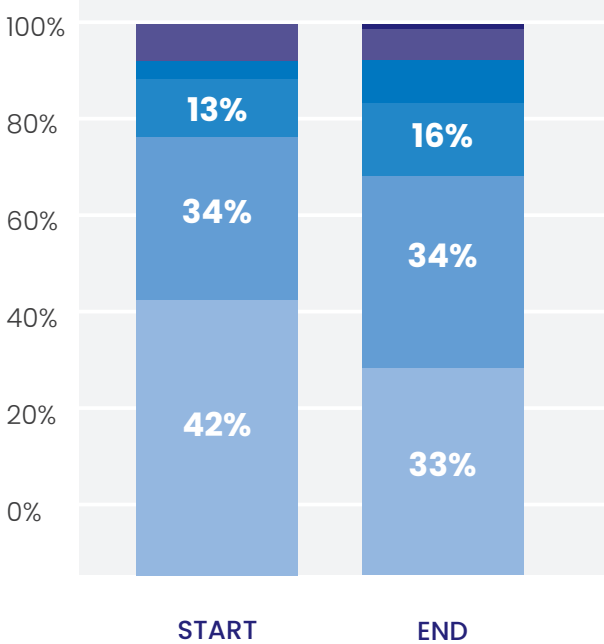
