Independent Student-Driven Learning

Lexia English is an adaptive, blended learning, speaking, and listening program that supports students' English language development through academic conversations. The software is designed to help Emergent Bilingual students in grades K-6 acquire higher language proficiency levels of English. It integrates speaking, listening, and grammar, while emphasizing the language of content in Math, Science, Social Studies, General Knowledge, and Biographies.


Ongoing Progress Monitoring

Supporting Needs of Diverse Learners

Lexia English was designed with the understanding that learners possess funds of knowledge that help them become bilingual. The program integrates cultural elements in texts and images throughout to activate background knowledge and accelerate new learning. Students progress linguistically and academically at their own pace thanks to the embedded **Speech Recognition Technology** that provides immediate, guided, corrective feedback with respect to diverse accents.

A Note About Our Characters

The characters in Lexia English are all multilingual and represent the top 13 languages spoken in the United States. All 17 characters have a different home language and most of them have accents like all speakers of English. They gradually reveal their backgrounds and personal stories as students progress through each level of the program.

Lexia English Alignment to CA ELD Standards

The CA ELD Standards describe the key knowledge, skills, and abilities that students who are learning English as a new language need to access, engage with, and achieve in grade-level academic content. There are three strands to the CA ELD Standards: Part I—Interacting in Meaningful Ways, Part II—Learning About How English Works, and Part III—Using Foundational Literacy Skills. Lexia English aligns to Parts I and II of the CA ELD Standards.

Levels 1-12 of Lexia English aligns to grades K-2 CA ELD Standards, and all Lexia English levels (1-19) aligns to CA ELD Standards for grades 3-6. Additionally, different Lexia English levels are matched to one of the three proficiency levels of the CA ELD Standards. The table below shows the alignment of Lexia English levels to CA ELD Standards proficiency levels.

A. Structuring Cohesive Texts	 During online and offline instruction, students analyze how texts are structured and organized. Listening passages are followed by comprehension questions that require an understanding of how texts work; for example, identifying the structure and purpose of compare and contrast, sequencing elements of a text, and identifying and analyzing cohesion and language resources and how they contribute to the way a text unfolds. During Skill Builders, students use these structure, organization, and cohesion concepts to write, revise, and present oral presentations. B. Expanding and Enriching Ideas	 A grammar concept that is a prominent feature of the language frames is presented and practiced over the course of an online unit or an offline lesson.
