## Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment

The Texas Education Agency designed the Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS) and TELPAS Alternate to assess the progress that Emergent Bilingual (EB) students make in learning the English language. TELPAS assesses the abilities outlined in the English Language Proficiency Standards (ELPS) student expectations and reports performance in alignment with the ELPS proficiency level descriptors (PLDs).

Educators use the PLDs throughout the school year as a formative assessment of the English language proficiency levels of their students. Teachers can monitor progress and tailor second language instruction to the proficiency levels of Emergent Bilinguals as those students learn more English.

## Lexia® English Language Development™

Lexia English uses a cutting-edge speech recognition engine to provide students with immediate feedback on their speaking tasks. ## Videos With Multiple Responses

### TELPAS example

Students are asked to watch various fiction and nonfiction videos and then answer multiple choice questions and give speaking responses.

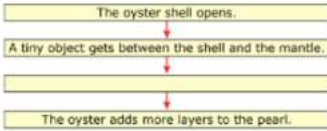
### How does Lexia English support this?

Students listen to various videos and characters explaining diagrams, pictures, and other organizers across multiple subject areas. Students are expected to answer multiple choice questions and respond orally.

## Comparing and Contrasting

### TELPAS example

Students must compare and contrast two separate photos or objects.

### How does Lexia English support this?

Students compare and contrast objects across multiple subjects and are provided language frames so they speak using the correct language structure. These language frames are transferrable across multiple language tasks.

Level 16, Wong Yi, encounter 2, open conversation

- First describe at least two ways these pictures are similar.
- Next describe at least two ways these pictures are different.

## Open-Ended Responses

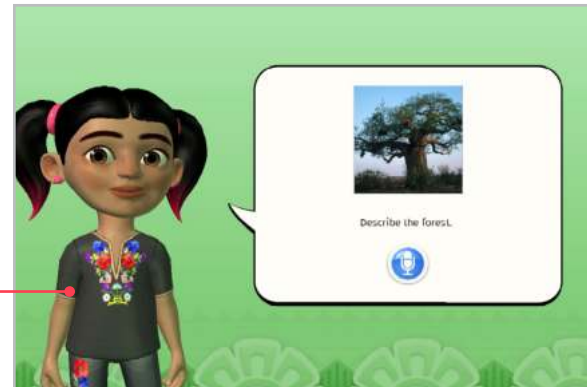
### TELPAS example

Students are asked a question after a picture is displayed. They must describe at least three things in the picture and tell as much as they can.



### How does Lexia English support this?

Students are given pictures and are guided through how to use correct verb tense and sentence structure to answer. By going through these grammar sequences, students are then able to produce answers to open-ended questions.



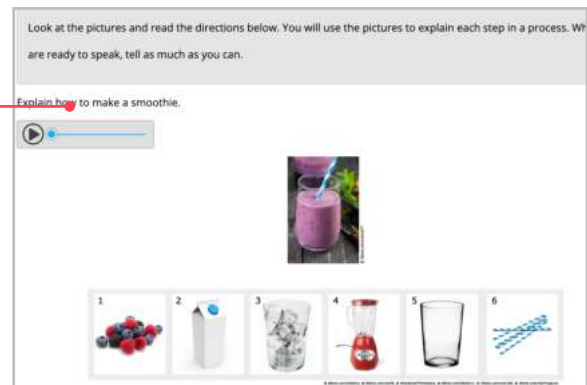
### Lexia English example

## Sequencing

### TELPAS example

Students must either describe or place objects in order.

Students listen to an audio clip on how to perform a sequencing action. They practice placing objects in order and speaking using sequencing terms.
