## The state of the student population



**2.5 million** children in K-12



**180,000** students attend 331 charter schools  
**370,000** students attend 1,700 nonpublic schools



**673** public school districts



**212,296** public school teachers



**10%** of students are English language learners

## The state of funding

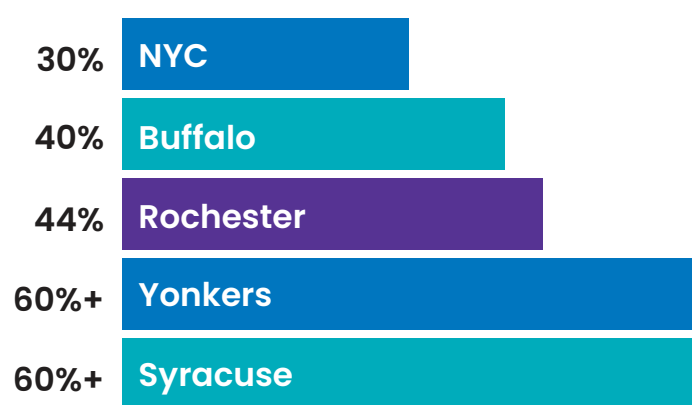
- Education is the largest area of state spending
- Ranked first nationally in school district spending per pupil for 15 years straight
- \$31.3 billion annual budget
- 7.1% annual increase in school aid
- Additional \$14 billion of federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds, available for use over multiple years

## How districts spent ESSER III funding in New York

Three most applied categories:

- 1 Addressing the impacts of COVID-19 on students
- 2 Funding evidence-based strategies to meet students' social, emotional, mental health, and academic needs
- 3 Providing extended learning opportunities

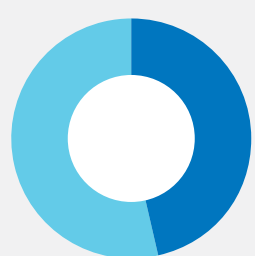

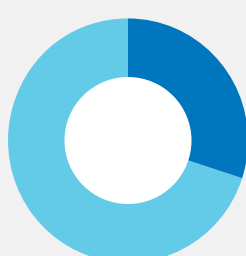
## The State of Literacy in NY

NY-ELA Assessment shows:



Only **46.6%** of students in grades 3-8 are deemed proficient in ELA

The Nation's Report Card results show:



**30%** of fourth graders are deemed proficient in reading



**32%** of eighth graders are deemed proficient in reading
