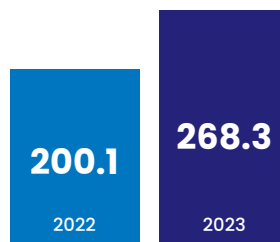

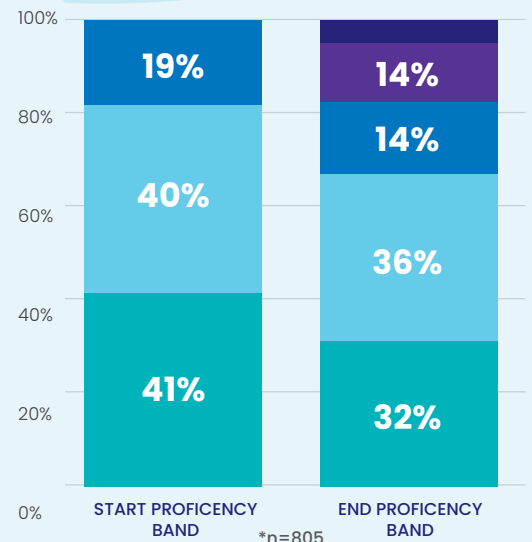
- On average, grade 1 students improved their ACCESS Overall scale scores by 68.2 points.
